20. 29. Requirements for sealing, addressing, delivery, opening and assessment of bids are stated in the tender document.
30. The lowest or any tender will not necessarily be accepted, and Mogale City reserves the right to accept a tender in whole or in part.
31. The Municipality reserves the right to appoint and not to appoint.
32. The validity period for this tender is one hundred and twenty (120) days.
33. A Corporate Social Responsibility contribution of two (2) percent inclusive of 15% VAT will be levied on all companies/ service providers appointed as successful bidders if such company(s)/service provider(s) are not based in the area of jurisdiction of Mogale City.
34. The Municipality reserve the right to negotiate a fair market related price with recommended bidders after a competitive bidding process or price quotation.
35. All tender prices must be inclusive of VAT for all registered VAT vendors.

**REGISTRATION AS A VAT VENDOR**

- 35.1 Non-VAT vendors do not have to include VAT in their bid prices, however they must submit bids for contracts that would, if successful, take their annual turnover above the threshold of R 1 million must include VAT in their price quoted and must therefore immediately upon award of the contract, register with the South African Revenue Service (SARS) as VAT vendors.
- 35.2 The award of contract would be (for non-VAT vendors who included VAT in their prices) conditional pending the successful bidder submitting proof of registration as VAT vendor with SARS within 21 days of award.
- 35.3 In all instances where the bidder has excluded VAT from the prices quoted, if the bidder is successful, the letter of appointment will clearly state that the price at which the contract is awarded is exclusive of VAT and that VAT will not be added on at any stage after the contract has been signed.
- 35.4 The successful bidder will have to absorb the adverse financial implications of not including VAT in the price quoted.

36. All bid prices must be in RSA currency and inclusive of Value Added Tax (VAT).
37. Bids will be opened immediately after the closing date and time in a venue to be indicated.
38. No bids will be accepted from persons in the service of state as it is defined in the Municipal Finance Management Act and Regulations.

**THE NATIONAL TREASURY: Republic of South Africa 3**  
**General Conditions of Contract**

**1. Definitions**

1. The following terms shall be interpreted as indicated:

1.1 "Closing time" means the date and hour specified in the bidding documents for the receipt of bids.

1.2 "Contract" means the written agreement entered into between the purchaser and the supplier, as recorded in the contract form signed by the parties, including all attachments and appendices thereto and all documents incorporated by reference therein.

1.3 "Contract price" means the price payable to the supplier under the contract for the full and proper performance of his contractual obligations.

1.4 "Corrupt practice" means the offering, giving, receiving, or soliciting of anything of value to influence the action of a public official in the procurement process or in contract execution.

1.5 "Countervailing duties" are imposed in cases where an enterprise abroad is subsidized by its government and encouraged to market its products internationally.

1.6 "Country of origin" means the place where the goods were mined, grown or produced or from which the services are supplied. Goods are produced when, through manufacturing, processing or substantial and major assembly of components, a commercially recognized new product results that is substantially different in basic characteristics or in purpose or utility from its components.

1.7 "Day" means calendar day.

1.8 "Delivery" means delivery in compliance of the conditions of the contract or order.

1.9 "Delivery ex stock" means immediate delivery directly from stock actually on hand.

1.10 "Delivery into consignees store or to his site" means delivered and unloaded in the specified store or depot or on the specified site in compliance with the conditions of the contract or order, the supplier bearing all risks and charges involved until the goods are so delivered and a valid receipt is obtained.

1.11 "Dumping" occurs when a private enterprise abroad market its goods on own initiative in the RSA at lower prices than that of the country of origin and which have the potential to harm the local industries in the RSA.

1.12 "Force majeure" means an event beyond the control of the supplier and not involving the supplier's fault or negligence and not foreseeable. Such events may include, but is not restricted to, acts of the purchaser in its sovereign capacity, wars or revolutions, fires, floods, epidemics, quarantine restrictions and freight embargoes.

1.13 "Fraudulent practice" means a misrepresentation of facts in order to influence a procurement process or the execution of a contract to the detriment of any bidder, and includes collusive practice among bidders (prior to or after bid submission) designed to establish bid prices at artificial non-competitive levels and to deprive the bidder of the benefits of free and open competition.

1.14 "GCC" means the General Conditions of Contract.

- 1.15 "Goods" means all of the equipment, machinery, and/or other materials that the supplier is required to supply to the purchaser under the contract.
- 1.16 "Imported content" means that portion of the bidding price have been or are still To be imported (whether by the supplier or his subcontractors) and which costs Are inclusive of the costs abroad, plus freight and other direct importation costs such as landing costs, dock dues, import duty, sales duty or other similar tax or duty at the South African place of entry as well as transportation and handling charges to the Factory in the Republic where the goods covered by the bid will be manufactured.
- 1.17 "Local content" means that portion of the bidding price, which is not included in the imported content provided that local manufacture does take place.
- 1.18 "Manufacture" means the production of products in a factory using labour, materials, components and machinery and includes other related value-adding activities.
- 1.19 "Order" means an official written order issued for the supply of goods or works or the rendering of a service.
- 1.20 "Project site," where applicable, means the place indicated in bidding documents.
- 1.21 "Purchaser" means the organization purchasing the goods.
- 1.22 "Republic" means the Republic of South Africa.
- 1.23 "SCC" means the Special Conditions of Contract.
- 1.24 "Services" means those functional services ancillary to the Supply of the goods, such as transportation and any other incidental services, such as installation, commissioning, provision of technical assistance, training, catering, gardening, security, maintenance and other such obligations of the supplier covered under the contract.
- 1.25 "Supplier" means the successful bidder who is awarded the contract to maintain and administer the required and specified service(s) to the State.
- 1.26 "Tort" means in breach of contract.
- 1.27 "Turnkey" means a procurement process where one service provider assumes total responsibility for all aspects of the project and delivers the full end product service required by the contract.
- 1.28 "Written" or "in writing" means hand-written in ink or any form of electronic or mechanical writing.

## **2. Application**

- 2.1 These general conditions are applicable to all bids, contracts and orders including bids for functional and professional services (excluding professional services related to the building and construction industry), sales, hiring, letting and the granting or acquiring of rights, but excluding immovable property, unless otherwise indicated in the bidding documents.
- 2.2 Where applicable, special conditions of contract are also laid down to cover specific goods, services or works.
- 2.3 Where such special conditions of contract are in conflict with these general conditions, the special conditions shall apply.

## **3. General**

- 3.1 Unless otherwise indicated in the bidding documents, the purchaser shall not be liable for any expense incurred in the preparation and submission of a bid. Where applicable a nonrefundable fee for documents may be charged.
- 3.2 Invitations to bid are usually published in locally distributed news media and on the municipality/municipal entity website.

#### **4. Standards**

4.1 The goods supplied shall conform to the standards mentioned in the bidding documents and specifications.

#### **5. Use of contract documents and information inspection**

5.1 The supplier shall not, without the purchaser's prior written consent, disclose the contract, or any provision thereof, or any specification, plan, drawing, pattern, sample, or information furnished by or on behalf of the purchaser in connection therewith, to any person other than a person employed by the supplier in the performance of the contract. Disclosure to any such employed person shall be made in confidence and shall extend only so far as may be necessary for purposes of such performance.

5.2 The supplier shall not, without the purchaser's prior written consent, make use of any document or information mentioned in GCC clause 5.1 except for purposes of performing the contract.

5.3 Any document, other than the contract itself mentioned in GCC clause 5.1 shall remain the property of the purchaser and shall be returned (all copies) to the purchaser on completion of the supplier's performance under the contract if so required by the purchaser.

5.4 The supplier shall permit the purchaser to inspect the supplier's records relating to the performance of the supplier and to have them audited by auditors appointed by the purchaser, if so required by the purchaser.

#### **6. Patent Rights**

6.1 The supplier shall indemnify the purchaser against all third-party claims of infringement of patent, trademark, or industrial design rights arising from use of the goods or any part thereof by the purchaser.

6.2 When a supplier developed documentation / projects for the municipality / municipal entity, the intellectual, copy and patent rights or ownership of such documents or projects will vest in the municipality / municipal entity.

#### **7. Performance security**

7.1 Within thirty (30) days of receipt of the notification of contract award, the successful bidder shall furnish to the purchaser the performance security of the amount specified in SCC.

7.2 The proceeds of the performance security shall be payable to the purchaser as compensation for any loss resulting from the supplier's failure to complete his obligations under the contract.

7.3 The performance security shall be denominated in the currency of the contract, or in a freely convertible currency acceptable to the purchaser and shall be in one of the following forms:

(a) a bank guarantee or an irrevocable letter of credit issued by a reputable bank located in the purchaser's country or abroad, acceptable to the purchaser, in the form provided in the bidding documents or another form acceptable to the purchaser; or

(b) a cashier's or certified cheque.

7.4 The performance security will be discharged by the purchaser and returned to the supplier not later than thirty (30) days following the date of completion of the supplier's performance obligations under the contract, including any warranty obligations, unless otherwise specified.

## **8. Inspections, tests and analyses**

8.1 All pre-bidding testing will be for the account of the bidder.

8.2 If it is a bid condition that goods to be produced or services to be rendered should at any stage be subject to inspections, tests and analyses, the bidder or contractor's premises shall be open, at all reasonable hours, for inspection by a representative of the purchaser or organization acting on behalf of the purchaser.

8.3 If there are no inspection requirements indicated in the bidding documents and no mention is made in the contract, but during the contract period it is decided that inspections shall be carried out, the purchaser shall itself make the necessary arrangements, including payment arrangements with the testing authority concerned.

8.4 If the inspections, tests and analyses referred to in clauses 8.2 and 8.3 show the goods to be in accordance with the contract requirements, the cost of the inspections, tests and analyses shall be defrayed by the purchaser.

8.5 Where the goods or services referred to in clauses 8.2 and 8.3 do not comply with the contract requirements, irrespective of whether such goods or services are accepted or not, the cost in connection with these inspections, tests or analyses shall be defrayed by the supplier.

8.6 Goods and services which are referred to in clauses 8.2 and 8.3 and which do not comply with the contract requirements may be rejected.

8.7 Any contract goods may on or after delivery be inspected, tested or analysed and may be rejected if found not to comply with the requirements of the contract. Such rejected goods shall be held at the cost and risk of the supplier who shall, when called upon, remove them immediately at his own cost and forthwith substitute them with goods, which do comply with the requirements of the contract. Failing such removal the rejected goods shall be returned at the suppliers cost and risk. Should the supplier fail to provide the substitute goods forthwith, the purchaser may, without giving the supplier further opportunity to substitute the rejected goods, purchase such goods as may be necessary at the expense of the supplier.

8.8 The provisions of clauses 8.4 to 8.7 shall not prejudice the right of the purchaser to cancel the contract on account of a breach of the conditions thereof, or to act in terms of Clause 22 of GCC.

## **9. Packing**

9.1 The supplier shall provide such packing of the goods as is required to prevent their damage or deterioration during transit to their final destination, as indicated in the contract. The packing shall be sufficient to withstand, without limitation, rough handling during transit and exposure to extreme temperatures, salt and precipitation during transit, and open storage. Packing, case size weights shall take into consideration, where appropriate, the remoteness of the goods' final destination and the absence of heavy handling facilities at all points in transit.

9.2 The packing, marking, and documentation within and outside the packages shall comply strictly with such special requirements as shall be expressly provided for in the contract, including additional requirements, if any, and in any subsequent Instructions ordered by the purchaser.

## **10. Delivery and documents**

10.1 Delivery of the goods and arrangements for shipping and clearance obligations, shall be made by the supplier in accordance with the terms specified in the Contract.



## **11. Insurance**

11.1 The goods supplied under the contract shall be fully insured in a freely Convertible currency against loss or damage incidental to manufacture or acquisition, transportation, storage and delivery in the manner specified.

## **12. Transportation**

12.1 Should a price other than an all-inclusive delivered price be required, this shall be specified.

## **13. Incidental Services**

13.1 The supplier may be required to provide any or all of the following services, including additional services, if any:

- (a) Performance or supervision of on-site assembly and/or commissioning of the supplied goods;
- (b) Furnishing of tools required for assembly and/or maintenance of the supplied goods;
- (c) Furnishing of a detailed operations and maintenance manual for each appropriate unit of the supplied goods;
- (d) performance or supervision or maintenance and/or repair of the supplied goods, for a period of time agreed by the parties, provided that this service shall not relieve the supplier of any warranty obligations under this contract; and
- (e) Training of the purchaser's personnel, at the supplier's plant and/or on-site, in assembly, start-up, operation, maintenance, and/or repair of the supplied goods.

13.2 Prices charged by the supplier for incidental services, if not included in the contract price for the goods, shall be agreed upon in advance by the parties and shall not exceed the prevailing rates charged to other parties by the supplier for similar services.

## **14. Spare parts**

14.1 As specified, the supplier may be required to provide any or all of the following materials, notifications, and information pertaining to spare parts manufactured or distributed by the supplier:

- (a) such spare parts as the purchaser may elect to purchase from the supplier, provided that this election shall not relieve the supplier of any warranty obligations under the contract; and
- (b) in the event of termination of production of the spare parts:
  - (i) advance notification to the purchaser of the pending termination, in sufficient time to permit the purchaser to procure needed requirements; and
  - (ii) following such termination, furnishing at no cost to the purchaser, the blueprints, drawings, and specifications of the spare parts, if requested.

## **15. Warranty**

15.1 The supplier warrants that the goods supplied under the contract are new, unused, of the most recent or current models, and that they incorporate all recent improvements in design and materials unless provided otherwise in the contract. The supplier further warrants that all goods supplied under this contract shall have no defect, arising from design, materials, or workmanship (except when the design and/or material is required by the purchaser's specifications) or from any act or omission of the supplier, that may develop under normal use of the supplied goods in the conditions prevailing in the country of final destination.

15.2 This warranty shall remain valid for twelve (12) months after the goods, or any portion thereof as the case may be, have been delivered to and accepted at the final destination

indicated in the contract, or for eighteen (18) months after the date of shipment from the port or place of loading in the source country, whichever period concludes earlier, unless specified otherwise.

15.3 The purchaser shall promptly notify the supplier in writing of any claims arising under this warranty.

15.4 Upon receipt of such notice, the supplier shall, within the period specified and with all reasonable speed, repair or replace the defective goods or parts thereof, without costs to the purchaser.

15.5 If the supplier, having been notified, fails to remedy the defect(s) within the period specified, the purchaser may proceed to take such remedial action as may be necessary, at the supplier's risk and expense and without prejudice to any other rights which the purchaser may have against the supplier under the contract.

## **16. Payment**

16.1 The method and conditions of payment to be made to the supplier under this contract shall be specified.

16.2 The supplier shall furnish the purchaser with an invoice accompanied by a copy of the delivery note and upon fulfillment of other obligations stipulated in the contract.

16.3 Payments shall be made promptly by the purchaser, but in no case later than thirty (30) days after submission of an invoice or claim by the supplier.

16.4 Payment will be made in Rand unless otherwise stipulated.

## **17. Prices**

17.1 Prices charged by the supplier for goods delivered and services performed under the contract shall not vary from the prices quoted by the supplier in his bid, with the exception of any price adjustments authorized or in the purchaser's request for bid validity extension, as the case may be.

## **18. Variation orders**

18.1 In cases where the estimated value of the envisaged changes in purchase does not vary more than 15% of the total value of the original contract, the contractor may be instructed to deliver the goods or render the services as such. In cases of measurable quantities, the contractor may be approached to reduce the unit price, and such offers may be accepted provided that there is no escalation in price.

## **19. Assignment**

19.1 The supplier shall not assign, in whole or in part, its obligations to perform under the contract, except with the purchaser's prior written consent.

## **20. Subcontracts**

20.1 The supplier shall notify the purchaser in writing of all subcontracts awarded under this contracts if not already specified in the bid. Such notification, in the original bid or later, shall not relieve the supplier from any liability or obligation under the contract.

## **21. Delays in the supplier's performance**

21.1 Delivery of the goods and performance of services shall be made by the supplier in accordance with the time schedule prescribed by the purchaser in the contract.

21.2 If at any time during performance of the contract, the supplier or its subcontractor(s) should encounter conditions impeding timely delivery of the goods and performance of services, the supplier shall promptly notify the purchaser in writing of the fact of the delay, its likely duration and its cause(s). As soon as practicable after receipt of the supplier's

notice, the purchaser shall evaluate the situation and may at his discretion extend the supplier's time for performance, with or without the imposition of penalties, in which case the extension shall be ratified by the parties by amendment of contract.

21.3 The right is reserved to procure outside of the contract small quantities or to have minor essential services executed if an emergency arises, the supplier's point of supply is not situated at or near the place where the goods are required, or the supplier's services are not readily available.

21.4 Except as provided under GCC Clause 25, a delay by the supplier in the performance of its delivery obligations shall render the supplier liable to the imposition of penalties, pursuant to GCC Clause 22, unless an extension of time is agreed upon pursuant to GCC Clause 22.2 without the application of penalties.

21.5 Upon any delay beyond the delivery period in the case of a goods contract, the purchaser shall, without cancelling the contract, be entitled to purchase goods of a similar quality and up to the same quantity in substitution of the goods not supplied in conformity with the contract and to return any goods delivered later at the supplier's expense and risk, or to cancel the contract and buy such goods as may be required to complete the contract and without prejudice to his other rights, be entitled to claim damages from the supplier.

## **22. Penalties**

22.1 Subject to GCC Clause 25, if the supplier fails to deliver any or all of the goods or to perform the services within the period(s) specified in the contract, the purchaser shall, without prejudice to its other remedies under the contract, deduct from the contract price, as a penalty, a sum calculated on the delivered price of the delayed goods or unperformed services using the current prime interest rate calculated for each day of the delay until actual delivery or performance. The purchaser may also consider termination of the contract pursuant to GCC Clause 23.

## **23. Termination for default**

23.1 The purchaser, without prejudice to any other remedy for breach of contract, by written notice of default sent to the supplier, may terminate this contract in whole or in part:

(a) if the supplier fails to deliver any or all of the goods within the period(s) specified in the contract, or within any extension thereof granted by the purchaser pursuant to GCC Clause 21.2;

(b) if the supplier fails to perform any other obligation(s) under the contract; or

(c) if the supplier, in the judgement of the purchaser, has engaged in corrupt or fraudulent practices in competing for or in executing the contract.

23.2 In the event the purchaser terminates the contract in whole or in part, the purchaser may procure, upon such terms and in such manner, as it deems appropriate, goods, works or services similar to those undelivered, and the supplier shall be liable to the purchaser for any excess costs for such similar goods, works or services. However, the supplier shall continue performance of the contract to the extent not terminated.

23.3 Where the purchaser terminates the contract in whole or in part, the purchaser may decide to impose a restriction penalty on the supplier by prohibiting such supplier from doing business with the public sector for a period not exceeding 10 years.

23.4 If a purchaser intends imposing a restriction on a supplier or any person associated with the supplier, the supplier will be allowed a time period of not more than fourteen (14) days to provide reasons why the envisaged restriction should not be imposed. Should the supplier fail to respond within the stipulated fourteen (14) days the purchaser may regard the supplier as having no objection and proceed with the restriction.

23.5 Any restriction imposed on any person by the purchaser will, at the discretion of the purchaser, also be applicable to any other enterprise or any partner, manager, director or other person who wholly or partly exercises or exercised or may exercise control over the enterprise of the first-mentioned person, and with which enterprise or person the first-mentioned person, is or was in the opinion of the purchaser actively associated.

23.6 If a restriction is imposed, the purchaser must, within five (5) working days of such imposition, furnish the National Treasury, with the following information:

- (i) the name and address of the supplier and / or person restricted by the purchaser;
- (ii) the date of commencement of the restriction
- (iii) the period of restriction; and
- (iv) the reasons for the restriction.

These details will be loaded in the National Treasury's central database of suppliers or persons prohibited from doing business with the public sector.

23.7. If a court of law convicts a person of an offence as contemplated in sections 12 or 13 of the Prevention and Combating of Corrupt Activities Act, No. 12 of 2004, the court may also rule that such person's name be endorsed on the Register for Bid Defaulters. When a person's name has been endorsed on the Register, the person will be prohibited from doing business with the public sector for a period not less than five years and not more than 10 years. The National Treasury is empowered to determine the period of restriction and each case will be dealt with on its own merits. According to section 32 of the Act the Register must be open to the public. The Register can be perused on the National Treasury website.

## **24. Antidumping and countervailing duties and rights**

24.1 When, after the date of bid, provisional payments are required, or anti-dumping or countervailing duties are imposed, or the amount of a provisional payment or anti-dumping or countervailing right is increased in respect of any dumped or subsidized import, the State is not liable for any amount so required or imposed, or for the amount of any such increase. When, after the said date, such a provisional payment is no longer required or any such anti-dumping or countervailing right is abolished, or where the amount of such provisional payment or any such right is reduced, any such favorable difference shall on demand be paid forthwith by the supplier to the purchaser or the purchaser may deduct such amounts from moneys (if any) which may otherwise be due to the supplier in regard to goods or services which he delivered or rendered, or is to deliver or render in terms of the contract or any other contract or any other amount which may be due to him.

## **25. Force Majeure**

25.1 Notwithstanding the provisions of GCC Clauses 22 and 23, the supplier shall not be liable for forfeiture of its performance security, damages, or termination for default if and to the extent that his delay in performance or other failure to perform his obligations under the contract is the result of an event of force majeure.

25.2 If a force majeure situation arises, the supplier shall promptly notify the purchaser in writing of such condition and the cause thereof. Unless otherwise directed by the purchaser in writing, the supplier shall continue to perform its obligations under the contract as far as is reasonably practical, and shall seek all reasonable alternative means for performance not prevented by the force majeure event.

## **26. Termination for insolvency**

26.1 The purchaser may at any time terminate the contract by giving written notice to the supplier if the supplier becomes bankrupt or otherwise insolvent. In this event, termination will be without compensation to the supplier, provided that such termination will not

prejudice or affect any right of action or remedy, which has accrued or will accrue thereafter to the purchaser.

## **27. Settlement of Disputes**

27.1 If any dispute or difference of any kind whatsoever arises between the purchaser and the supplier in connection with or arising out of the contract, the parties shall make every effort to resolve amicably such dispute or difference by mutual consultation.

27.2 If, after thirty (30) days, the parties have failed to resolve their dispute or difference by such mutual consultation, then either the purchaser or the supplier may give notice to the other party of his intention to commence with mediation. No mediation in respect of this matter may be commenced unless such notice is given to the other party.

27.3 Should it not be possible to settle a dispute by means of mediation, it may be settled in a South African court of law.

27.4 Notwithstanding any reference to mediation and/or court proceedings herein, (a) the parties shall continue to perform their respective obligations under the contract unless they otherwise agree; and

(b) the purchaser shall pay the supplier any monies due the supplier for goods delivered and / or services rendered according to the prescripts of the contract.

## **28. Limitation of Liability**

28.1 Except in cases of criminal negligence or willful misconduct, and in the case of infringement pursuant to Clause 6;

(a) the supplier shall not be liable to the purchaser, whether in contract, tort, or otherwise, for any indirect or consequential loss or damage, loss of use, loss of production, or loss of profits or interest costs, provided that this exclusion shall not apply to any obligation of the supplier to pay penalties and/or damages to the purchaser; and

(b) the aggregate liability of the supplier to the purchaser, whether under the contract, in tort or otherwise, shall not exceed the total contract price, provided that this limitation shall not apply to the cost of repairing or replacing defective equipment.

## **29. Governing language**

29.1 The contract shall be written in English. All correspondence and other documents pertaining to the contract that is exchanged by the parties shall also be written in English.

## **30. Applicable law**

30.1 The contract shall be interpreted in accordance with South African laws, unless otherwise specified.

## **31. Notices**

31.1 Every written acceptance of a bid shall be posted to the supplier concerned by registered or certified mail and any other notice to him shall be posted by ordinary mail to the address furnished in his bid or to the address notified later by him in writing and such posting shall be deemed to be proper service of such notice.

31.2 The time mentioned in the contract documents for performing any act after such aforesaid notice has been given, shall be reckoned from the date of posting of such notice.

## **32. Taxes and duties**

32.1 A foreign supplier shall be entirely responsible for all taxes, stamp duties, license fees, and other such levies imposed outside the purchaser's country.

32.2 A local supplier shall be entirely responsible for all taxes, duties, license fees, etc., incurred until delivery of the contracted goods to the purchaser.

32.3 No contract shall be concluded with any bidder whose tax matters are not in order. Prior to the award of a bid SARS must have certified that the tax matters of the preferred bidder are in order.

32.4 No contract shall be concluded with any bidder whose municipal rates and taxes and municipal services charges are in arrears.

### **33. Transfer of contracts**

33.1 The contractor shall not abandon, transfer, cede assign or sublet a contract or part thereof without the written permission of the purchaser

### **34. Amendment of contracts**

34.1 No agreement to amend or vary a contract or order or the conditions, stipulations or provisions thereof shall be valid and of any force unless such agreement to amend or vary is entered into in writing and signed by the contracting parties. Any waiver of the requirement that the agreement to amend or vary shall be in writing, shall also be in writing.

### **35. Prohibition of restrictive practices:**

35.1 In terms of section 4 (1) (b) (iii) of the Competition Act No. 89 of **restrictive practices** 1998, as amended, an agreement between, or concerted practice by, firms, or a decision by an association of firms, is prohibited if it is between parties in a horizontal relationship and if a bidder(s) is / are or a contractor(s) was / were involved in collusive bidding.

35.2 If a bidder(s) or contractor(s) based on reasonable grounds or evidence obtained by the purchaser has / have engaged in the restrictive practice referred to above, the purchaser may refer the matter to the Competition Commission for investigation and possible imposition of administrative penalties as contemplated in section 59 of the Competition Act No 89 Of 1998.

35.3 If a bidder(s) or contractor(s) has / have been found guilty by the Competition Commission of the restrictive practice referred to above, the purchaser may, in addition and without prejudice to any other remedy provided for, invalidate the bid(s) for such item(s) offered, and / or terminate the contract in whole or part, and / or restrict the bidder(s) or contractor(s) from conducting business with the public sector for a period not exceeding ten (10) years and / or claim damages from the bidder(s) or contractor(s) concerned



## **BIDDERS TO BE EVALUATED ON FUNCTIONALITY**

5.(1) An organ of state must state in the bid documents if the bid will be evaluated on functionality.

(2) The evaluation criteria for measuring functionality must be objective.

(3) The bid documents must specify-

(a) the evaluation criteria for measuring functionality;

(a) the points for each criteria and, if any, each sub-criterion; and

(b) the minimum qualifying score for functionality.

(4) The minimum qualifying score for functionality for a bid to be considered further-

(a) must be determined separately for each bid; and

(b) may not be so-

(i) low that it may jeopardise the quality of the required goods or services; or

(ii) high that it is unreasonably restrictive.

(5) Points scored for functionality must be rounded off to the nearest two decimal places.

(6) A bid that fails to obtain the minimum qualifying score for functionality as indicated in the bid documents is not an acceptable bid.

## **1. INTRODUCTION**

### **1.1 BACKGROUND**

Mogale City Local Municipality was part of the Go-West Heritage Festival which was last hosted in September 2017. This festival was an annual event which became a popular event held throughout the West Rand region to celebrate September as a heritage month. Mogale City played a pivotal role as a host of the main music festival at that time, with no such event taking place since the festival ceased to exist almost ten years ago.

The Community Development Services Department seeks to implement a music festival that will be hosted as a flagship event in Mogale City, as was presented to, and approved by, the Executive Management Committee in the 2023/ 2024 Financial Year.

### **1.2 PROJECT DESCRIPTION**

Mogale City Local Municipality currently doesn't have any arts and culture flagship event since the demise of the Go-West Heritage Festival.

It is of great importance for the Municipality to host at least one signature event in a calendar year that will assist the Municipality to achieve the following objectives:

- To promote local economic development
- To encourage social cohesion amongst different racial and cultural groups within the Municipality
- Marketing Mogale City as a tourism destination
- To promote Arts and Culture within Mogale City
- To inspire a sense of pride to the residents of Mogale City

As witnessed during the hosting of the now defunct Go-West Heritage Festival, Mogale City Music Festival is envisaged to attract patrons, both locally and even outside the borders of the Gauteng Province.

People coming to Mogale City for the festival will spend their monies on buying food, beverages from the local shops, restaurants, and street vendors, while some visitors may also stay overnight in Mogale City, which will benefit the local hospitality businesses.



The festival is further expected to contribute in creating jobs for the local residents, as local companies will be utilized as service providers during the festival and its complementary activities. Businesses (such as minibus taxis) are bound to benefit through transporting people to and from the festival, whilst local artists and cultural groups (including developmental artists who would ordinarily struggle to get an opportunity to take part on a bigger stage) will also benefit from participating during the festival.

## **2. REQUIREMENTS**

An ideal service provider must be a South African company with proven track record in organizing, managing, and implementing music festivals. The proposer must show the ability to be able to raise funding through sponsorships.

## **3. CESSION OR ASSIGNMENT**

Neither the Council nor the appointed service provider shall cede or assign a contract for the organizing and implementation of the Music Festival or the rendering of services or any part thereof or any benefit or interest herein or thereunder to third parties without the written consent of the other being first had and obtained.

## **4. SCOPE OF WORK**

The service provider will be required to raise funding with endorsement support correspondence from the municipality, organize, manage, and implement the Annual Mogale City Music Festival for a period of three (3) years.

The scope of work – at a minimum - includes:

- 4.1 Development of a Mogale City signature event concept – reflecting of the city's offerings, brand identity and people.
- 4.2 Linked to the above, allow for segmented city stakeholders event concept input to ensure a well-developed and supported event concept idea is conceived.
- 4.3 A comprehensive 3-year event roll- out plan.
- 4.4 A detailed event marketing and promotion plan which will include the usage of amongst others, radio, television, electronic print media, digital and social media prior to and during the festival (Specify proposed list of radio stations, tv channels, print media, digital and social media platforms to be utilised).
- 4.5 Demonstrate the ability to source funding to allow for sustainability of the event.
- 4.6 Reporting and presenting to the Municipal Events Steering and Oversight Committee consisting of different Departments from within Mogale City Local Municipality at agreed intervals.
- 4.7 Planning, managing and execution of related build-up events and activities (including arts and culture buildup events) towards the main festival as part of a bigger plan to ensure culmination into hosting of a major festival.

- 4.8 Development of an Event/s Partners or Stakeholder Plan for increased stakeholder buy-in, support and promotion.
- 4.9 Planning, managing and execution of the main festival.
- 4.10 The appointed company will be required to design a comprehensive event layout plan, detailing stage location, audience areas, VIP zones, vendor stalls, Venue Operation Centre, and sanitation facilities. This plan must be submitted to the Municipality for review and approval prior to implementation.
- 4.11 The appointed service provider will be required to develop and implement a comprehensive Environmental Management Plan for the Mogale City Music Festival in line with South African environmental regulations addressing waste management, noise management, water and sanitation amongst others.
- 4.12 Mentoring and upskilling of local artists through workshops and other support related programmes
- 4.13 Securing, Contracting, Management and Remunerations of a minimum of twenty (20) local artists (to be sourced through the local arts and culture forum), and ten (10) national popular artists and Master/s of Ceremony (Include proposed list of music genres to be catered for in the event).
- 4.14 Liaison with artists for their technical riders, time for performance and other logistical requirements.
- 4.15 Mentoring and upskilling of local Small, Medium and Micro Enterprises (SMMEs), vendors, etc. A Plan on how local SMMEs will be developed and how skills will be transferred to them must be submitted as a returnable document.
- 4.16 To develop a risk and security management plan for the festival and execution of the plan.
- 4.17 Obtaining necessary regulatory permissions and approvals, including, but not limited to Event Categorization, Public Liability, Joint Operations Committee (JOC), Music and event regulatory organizations in South Africa such as South African Music Rights Organisation (SAMRO), and South African Music Performance Rights Association (SAMPRA), etc.
- 4.18 Branding and communications in collaboration with support rendered by the municipality's internal Marketing and Communications Division e.g. Event Communications and Promotions Plan.
- 4.19 Ensure availability of resources including venue readiness (i.e. Provision of mobile portable flushable ordinary and VIP toilets, grass cutting, fencing for demarcations), outdoor stage (fully certified by qualified engineer), full event sound system (mics, speakers), enough capacity backup generator, national and local artists, Cleaning services to maintain the cleanliness of the festival venue, including cleaning before, during and after the festival.
- 4.20 Ensure that the toilets are constantly serviced and maintained for cleanliness and provision of toilet paper on the day of the event.
- 4.21 All toilets must be at the venue at least 24 hours prior to the event
- 4.22 Provide and setup a VVIP marquee tent with anti-slippery flooring, suitable tables, chairs/ couches for a minimum of 50 people.

- 4.23 Provide and setup VIP marquee tent for a minimum of 100 people with suitable tables, chairs, chair covers with the Mogale City corporate colours.
- 4.24 Afford and setup for national Artists' and performers' marquee tent (partitioned into two areas) with tables, heavy-duty chairs, chair covers with the Mogale City corporate colours, and tablecloths with the Mogale City corporate colours.
- 4.25 Provide and setup water-proof stretch tents for local artists with chairs and chair covers with the Mogale City corporate colours.
- 4.26 Ensure provision of buffet refreshments, including bottled water, for VVIP, VIP, and platters for artists and officials working on the day of the festival.
- 4.27 Provide freestanding marquee tent for Venue Operation Centre (VOC) - Partitioned into two areas.
- 4.28 Provide crowd control barriers and temporary demarcation for VVIP, VIP, Stage, food stalls, marquees, etc.
- 4.29 Documentation of buildup and the main events through professionally captured photographs and video, using high-definition (HD) video cameras and drones.
- 4.30 Ensure availability of various categories of event tickets using a reputable and recognized ticketing system and/or booking agent
- 4.31 Identify and recruit local SMMEs to participate as vendors, performers, and service providers.
- 4.32 Develop criteria for SMME selection to ensure diversity and representation.
- 4.33 Provide workshops or training sessions for SMMEs on topics like business management, customer service, and event operations.
- 4.34 Offer mentorship opportunities connecting experienced professionals with SMMEs.
- 4.35 Create opportunities for local SMMEs to showcase their products and services during the festival.
- 4.36 Develop promotional strategies to highlight SMME offerings in festival marketing materials
- 4.37 Facilitate networking sessions for SMMEs to connect with larger businesses and potential collaborators.
- 4.38 Organize community engagement events to promote local entrepreneurship.
- 4.39 Provide a detailed Close out report within four weeks after the event regarding build-up events, Music Festival preparation and execution. The report should include amongst others the number of jobs created, skills developed or transferred, statistics of attendees, challenges encountered, photographic and video evidence, and recommendations for future events.

- 6.2 Functionality evaluation will be conducted in two phases:
- 6.2.1 The first phase will be based on the bidder's technical submission
- 6.2.2 The second phase on a presentation to be delivered by the shortlisted bidder(s) from phase one.
- 6.3 Bidders that achieve a minimum of **45 points for phase one** of the evaluation will proceed to phase two and be invited for presentations. Failure to meet the minimum scoring point on each technical criteria will result in the bidder not proceeding to the next phase of the evaluation. - The above-mentioned criterion regarding Functionality is required for responsiveness and therefore eligibility for the next stage of evaluation. This is done to determine the ability of each bidder to successfully execute the contract according to specifications.
- Bidder(s) will be required to achieve an overall score of **55 points out of 120 points** for functionality and not score 0 points on any of the individual criterion for all the phases in order to be evaluated further on price and specific goals.

- Failure to score **55 points out of 120 points** for functionality will lead to non-compliance and bidders will be rejected after this phase and not continue for price scoring.

- 9.2 All costs related to planning, organization and implementation, including payment of artists and suppliers, will be borne solely by the service provider.
- 9.3 All proceeds made from the ticket sales will be shared with the Municipality on a net commission basis; Bidders are required to provide a proposed fee structure outlining the offer in terms of the percentage to MCLM on their official company letterhead, duly dated and signed by the authorised signatory.
- 9.4 All proceeds as per the proposed and approved fee structure will be transferred by the successful bidder to the Municipality via electronic transfer within 10 working days after the event.
- 9.5 The successful bidder will be responsible for Joint Operations Committee (JOC), Event Categorisation.
- 9.6 The appointed service provider must ensure adequate insurance cover is in place for all aspects of the event, including but not limited to; Public Liability Insurance, Equipment Insurance (including stage, lighting, sound, screens, sanitation facilities, etc.) against theft, fire, vandalism, or accidental damage during transportation, installation, and the event period, Artist and Crew Cover.
